Is Greek grammar difficult? An additional aspect of the Greek language that many new learners have found challenging is its grammar. How is Greek grammar different from English grammar? Both English and Greek follow the basic SVO rule (Subject, Verb, Object). And, in general, most structures are the same in questions, indicative and imperative phrases, adjective and adverb placement, and so on. However, Greek has a more “relaxed” structure.

What is the grammatical structure of Greek? Greek sentence structure primarily follows the subject-verb-object (SVO) order. However, due to its highly inflected nature, Greek offers more flexibility in word order, which allows for emphasis and poetic expression.

Who wrote Greek grammar? Dionysius Thrax was credited traditionally as the author of the first extant grammar of Greek, *Art of Grammar* (????? ??????????, Τέχνη γραμματικ?). The Greek text, in August Immanuel Bekker's edition, runs to fifty pages.

Why English has Greek words? Indirect and direct borrowings. Since the living Greek and English languages were not in direct contact until modern times, borrowings were necessarily indirect, coming either

through Latin (through texts or through French and other vernaculars), or from Ancient Greek texts, not the living spoken language.

Does Greek have tenses? In the indicative mood there are seven tenses: present, imperfect, future, aorist (the equivalent of past simple), perfect, pluperfect, and future perfect. (The last two, especially the future perfect, are rarely used).

That is, while no language is inherently “difficult,” English speakers may find Greek hard to learn. And here’s my personal experience: as a native Greek, I have been studying English since I was 9 years old.
